


TINY HOMES



You may have heard about a movie called *Downsizing*, in which people are shrunk to a fraction of themselves to make every hard-earned dollar go much, much further. While the movie is obviously sheer fantasy, the idea of living more simply is not. For more and more people every year, that means choosing to live in a very small space and, hence, the birth of the tiny house movement. Not wanting to be tied down to a

sizeable mortgage, these micro-residences are comparable to studio apartments but stand alone on a foundation.







For folks who want even more flexibility, there are tiny houses on wheels. These tiny houses can be moved to a new location when desired. They typically range from 20' to 36' in length and about 8.5' in width. Even at 160 to 300 square feet, they can be smartly designed to provide all the necessary amenities, just scaled down a bit, and often include a sleeping loft to allow more space for daily activities.

You may have noticed a tiny house or two in our area recently. In the interest of full disclosure, there is one for sale sitting in my driveway at this very moment. It was designed by my husband, Patrick Sughrue, of Artisan Tiny House LLC, and built using structural insulated panels (SIPs) for comfort and durability. You may even have seen it at the three-day Tiny House Festival at the Clark County Fairgrounds back in September, attended by more than 7,000 people.

With the growth of the tiny house movement, conferences and jamborees are taking place all across the country. One in Colorado in 2015 expected 10,000 but drew over 30,000 in attendance. These events have hands-on workshops for DIYers and showcase myriad tiny home designs: from converted school buses to mini log cabins.

Somewhat curious, but not sure if tiny house living is right for you? If so, you might book a night or two at one of many tiny house hotels popping up everywhere and try it on for size.

2 cups flour 1/2 tsp. baking soda ½ tsp. salt ²/₃ cup softened butter 1/2 cup sugar ²/₃ cup brown sugar 1 egg 2 tsp. vanilla extract 2 cups chocolate chips

8 oz. softened cream cheese 1/2 cup sugar 1 egg 1 tsp vanilla extract


Instructions

Preheat oven to 350°. Line a 9×9 square baking pan with parchment paper or aluminum foil, and spray with nonstick spray. Whisk together flour, baking soda, and salt for crust. In a separate bowl, cream together butter, brown sugar, and sugar until fluffy. Add egg and vanilla and whip to incorporate. Add flour mixture and mix until combined. Fold in chocolate chips. Press 2/3 of the mixture into the bottom of the prepared pan to form an even layer. Combine filling ingredients and beat until blended. Spread filling over the cookie dough layer and level. Crumble remaining crust dough over the filling layer. Bake for 40 minutes, or until cheesecake is set and cookie dough has browned. Allow to cool completely and chill before slicing.

Chocolate. All those chocoholics now have more reason than ever to indulge in this delicious delicacy - iron. Don't reach for just any chocolate bar though. Go for the dark chocolate with 45 to 69 percent of cacao solids. Just three ounces packs an impressive 7 ounces of iron.

Spinach. Popeye loved this green leafy vegetable for good reason. He loaded up on his daily requirement of iron. At 3 mg per half cup of cooked spinach, this vegetable definitely delivers when it comes to iron.

Raisins. Although raisins are high in fructose, it is often overlooked that they contain iron. One-fourth cup of seedless raisins contains 1 mg of iron. Although that may not seem like a lot, it can add up over time.

If you want to boost your iron absorption, consume it with foods rich in Vitamin C. Orange juice, strawberries, melons, and broccoli can increase absorption, which can pay off for those want to increase their intake. Make sure that you get enough iron in your diet. A little vigilance today can pay off in better health tomorrow. Just ask Popeye.

Don't let the dreary days of winter leave you despondent. Get a head start on spring by planting your spring plants with your children. See

their excitement as your seeds begin to sprout with signs of life. Here are a few tips to get started:

Start Small. Don't try to plant everything. Start with a dozen plants and flowers. Aim for variety with different shapes, colors and types of plants or flowers.

Follow Directions. For your seed to thrive, it is important to follow the directions on the seed packet. Check out the number of days to maturity, which can vary from plant to plant.

Use A Seed-Starting Mix. Because of the delicate nature of seeds, it is best to use a seed-starting mix to ensure optimum results. The mix should be fluffy enough to hold moisture. Be sure the mix is not sticky, which can be problematic for the roots. Alternatives to seed-starting mix include compressed pellets of peat or coconut husk fibers (coir).

DON'T DEL START YOUR SPRING



Choose A Container.

Any clean container will do. If you are reusing an old pot, sterilize it with a solution of one part bleach to nine parts water. Make sure your container or pot has drainage

holes for excess water. Place a waterproof tray underneath your pots.

Place In A Sunny Spot. Light is essential for seeds. Artificial lights are one way to go to ensure your seeds get the light that they need. Or you might opt for a sunny location in your home, such as a south-facing window.

Water Your Seeds. When starting out, place your seeds in a moistened mix. Until the seeds sprout, cover the containers with a plastic bag. Once they have sprouted, pour water into the tray to water your seedlings. Watering from the top is not recommended because it can dislodge the sprouts and even be a breeding ground for disease.

Plants can be exciting for children and an enriching educational experience. Cultivate their love for plants and flowers this winter. If you haven't started your spring plants, don't delay. Start today!

creative WINTER CRAFTS

By the time February rolls around, you're probably tired of being cooped up inside avoiding the cold weather. If you're looking for some fun activities to get through the middle of winter, these are some easy and exciting projects that will provide hours of entertainment for you and the kids.

DIY CHALKBOARD

While drawing on the walls may seem taboo, it can be a great creative release for your children and an easy source of entertainment if planned well. Consider designating some wall space for a chalkboard. Chalkboard paint can be found at most local home improvement stores, but there are plenty of "recipes" online if you prefer to make your own. If you don't like the idea of painting an entire wall, paint a smaller section and use an inexpensive craft store frame to give your chalkboard a more designed, intentional look. Once the paint is dry, have fun drawing pictures and leaving notes for the entire family.

INDOOR GARDEN

If you live in a region where winter is cold and dreary, you'll be longing to see some green this month. Bring a little bit of the outdoors inside by planting an indoor winter garden. Find a space in your home that gets about six hours of sunlight each day, and decide what you want to plant. Many herbs do well indoors with minimal sunlight, such as parsley, thyme, oregano, rosemary and chives. Your kids will enjoy watching them grow, and as a bonus, they can be used for cooking. Succulents also make wonderful and colorful indoor gardens and require very little maintenance. Be sure to layer the bottom of your pots with pebbles so that water will drain correctly.

FAUX STAINED GLASS

Use coloring book pages for your pattern, and place them behind a plexiglass or plastic picture frame (these can be found at your local craft store). Using black puff paint, trace the pattern onto the plastic. Allow the black paint to dry overnight. The next day, mix clear craft glue with acrylic paint in your favorite colors. Use these color mixtures to fill in the pattern you've created. Once dry, these fun and colorful patterns can be placed on or near windows to brighten up your space.


