





VISIUMA Do Your Homework



Visa, Travel Permits, Paperwork

A U.S. citizen must get an "authorized travel" permit for Cuba. There are 12 permissible visa categories for traveling to Cuba. You will also need to purchase a \$50 Cuban tourist card, which airlines often now include with your flight tickets. Cuba also requires a health insurance card, which can be purchased at departing airports.

Lodging

Part of the charm of Cuba is the 1950s, frozen-in-time aesthetic of the country. There are very few hotels, most of which are government-owned and compare poorly to other country's hotel resorts - often expensive and booked far in advance. A popular choice is a stay in the **casa particulars**. These are rooms in private homes and typically include authentic meals. The Airbnb business is also taking hold in Cuba and is a good way to book ahead of time.

Transportation

While the symbol of Cuba's tourism is the collection of nostalgic cars, these pretty vintage machines are exclusively for tourists to ride in (not drive) and they only go through a select route in Havana. There are rental cars available and they are some of the only newer model cars on the island. Two wise options are using Cuba's extensive bus system or a taxi colectivo, which affords you flexibility, the ability to share rides and a driver that may serve as an impromptu tour guide. Keep in mind Havana can easily be seen and explored on foot.

Cuba uses the CUC currency for the American dollar. The American exchange rate isn't as good as the European, so it is suggested you exchange American dollars for euros in the U.S. and then exchange those for CUC in Cuba. Cuba is lacking in debit and credit card services so bring plenty of cash - suggested at least \$200 a day - as you won't be swiping much.

Additional Tips:

Do not drink the water: boil all water or better yet, bring a self-filtering water bottle with you.

Internet and Cell Phones Service: both are limited and in some cases non-existent. Take this as a chance to unplug. Cuban Products: you can bring up to \$400 worth of goods back with you, including up to \$100 worth of Cuban cigars.

Cuba has a long way to go before it is a hot spot but it is certainly a unique and exciting vacation destination in the Caribbean.





My family was first introduced to *Skippyjon Jones* by my sister, a longtime kindergarten teacher, when my oldest turned five. She gave him Judy Schachner's original book AND she read it to us all, using her very best Spanish accent. Schachner's books and *Skippyjon Jones* were a huge part of our bedtime routines for the next several years.

Skippyjon is a cute and mischievous Siamese cat with extraordinarily large ears. He has a vivid imagination and often pretends he is a chihuahua who goes by the name of Skippito Friskito. Schachner's books are beautifully illustrated and have so many catchy phrases that we are still known to quote them even though my youngest is now almost eight years old! The stories are even more fun if you throw in a Spanish accent (even if it's a pathetic attempt at one), and sing some of the verses with a bit of a mariachi vibe.

As the series progresses, Skippyjon's adventures lead him to fend off a bumblebee bean-stealing bandit, visit an Egyptian tomb in search of divine peas, learn what caused the dinosaurs' extinction, travel to the red planet of chili powder, go to dog school, swing on a flying trapeze, play in the snow, and so much more. In the middle of these are side stories of his triplet sisters, Jillyboo, Jujube, and Jezebel. All of the books begin with Skippyjon in a bit of trouble with Mama Junebug Jones, and end with some form of forgiveness at home. Morals of the story are there, and are good, but the books are just plain fun to read for parents and children alike.





Chimichuri Sauce

I added a parsley plant to the herb bed this last spring; it has thrived and outgrown all of the other herbs! So, what to do with all this parsley? Chimichurri sauce!!

This recipe idea originates from Argentina and is mostly served as a topping on steak, or as a marinade.

Ingredients:

Approx 1-1/2 cups packed flat-leaf parsley (it must be flat leaf - the other is way too peppery & spicy!) $2 \ {\rm cloves\ garlic}$ $1/3 \ {\rm cup\ olive\ oil}$ $1/4 \ {\rm cup\ red\ wine\ vinegar}$ ${\rm Salt\ \&\ pepper\ to\ taste}$

Place all of the ingredients in a small food processor and pulse until the consistency is coarsely chopped but yet will "drizzle" over your entree.

Juice of one lemon wedge


This sauce is perfect for spicing up your simple protein entree, making your dinner a little more elegant and special. My menu planning is primarily Paleo and Whole30; this type of recipe helps keep your meal planning healthy and helps avoid rich, heavy cream sauces and toppings. Slice two chicken breasts lengthwise, season with olive oil, salt, and pepper and grill lightly ... Chimichurri sauce does the rest! Also serve over salmon, just lightly seasoned and baked. tive contests. Those desiring an opportunity to learn to drive a manual transmission vehicle will relish that option. GET YOUR ZZZs


