




Tohn Schauer is in session. John has been playing baseball for nine years and truly loves everything about the sport, especially the competition

S'mores Bars





This delicious recipe is a new take on a classic dessert that everyone loves. It features marshmallows and chocolate combined with a delicious homemade graham cracker crust that is to die for!

Ingredients

-1 stick of butter, room temperature

-1/4 cup brown sugar

-½ cup sugar

-2 king-sized Hershey's milk chocolate bars

-1 large egg

 $-1\frac{1}{2}$ cups of marshmallow creme

-1 tsp vanilla extract

-1 1/3 cups all-purpose flour

-¾ cup graham cracker crumbs (about 7 graham crackers)

-1 tsp. baking powder

-1/4 tsp. salt Instructions

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Grease an 8-inch square baking pan. Use an electric mixer to cream together butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in egg and vanilla. Set aside. Meanwhile, whisk together flour, graham cracker crumbs, baking powder, and salt. Slowly add flour mixture to the creamed butter mixture until combined. Divide dough in half and press half of dough into an even layer on the bottom of the prepared pan. Place chocolate bars over dough. Two king-sized Hershey's bars should fit perfectly side by side. Spread chocolate with marshmallow creme or fluff. Place remaining dough in a single layer on top of the fluff (most easily achieved by flattening the dough into small shingles and laying them together). Bake for 30 to 35 minutes, until lightly browned. Be sure to cool completely before cutting into bars.

Makes 16 squares.




Any visit to paradise also requires pampering, shopping and nightlife; don't worry, the Seychelles offer their share of it all.






